New Pilot Projects Funded!

Three CANNeCTIN pilot projects were approved for funding in the CANNeCTIN December 2008 Pilot Funding Competition:

- **Heart Failure and Conditioned Nutritional Deficiency in the Myocardium** - Malcolm Arnold (UWO); \$40,000; Heart Failure Working Group
- **Left Atrial Appendage Occlusion Study I: LAAOS I** - Richard Whitlock (McMaster); \$30,000; Cardiac Surgery Working Group
- **Prevention of Arrhythmia Device Infection Trial (PADIT)** - Andrew Krahn (UWO); \$50,000; Arrhythmia Working Group

New CANNeCTIN Knowledge Translation Project

Cluster RCT to assess the effect of using a simple warfarin dose algorithm in Canadian general practices

Poor INR control is common in Canada and is associated with adverse clinical outcomes. Researchers from the CANNeCTIN KT Working Group (R. Nieuwlaat, B. Haynes, J. Eikelboom, J. Tu, J. Cox, and S. Connolly) are undertaking a study in 900 patients from 45 family practices across the country to evaluate whether or not family physicians can improve the quality of INR control by using a simple warfarin maintenance dosing algorithm, in either paper or web-based forms.
