



Prof. D. Prabhakaran a Cardiologist and Epidemiologist is Director of Centre for Chronic Disease Control (CCDC) and Center of Excellence in Cardio-metabolic Risk Reduction in South Asia (a Strategic Grant funded by NHLBI and United Health) at the Public Health Foundation of India and former faculty member of All India Institute of Medical Sciences.
